

Electronic Signatures in South Africa

Electronic signatures in South Africa are legally recognised in South African Law as provided for by the Electronic Communications and Transactions Act (Act no. 25 of 2002), as amended in 2011 and in effect (ECTA). “Electronic Signature” means data attached to, incorporated in, or logically associated with other data and which is intended by the user to serve as a signature.



Legality of Electronic Signatures in South Africa

The Electronic Communications and Transactions Act (ECTA) 25 of 2002 intends to provide for the facilitation and regulation of electronic communications and transactions.

“An electronic signature is not without legal force and effect merely on the grounds that it is in electronic form, and may be used by the parties to an electronic transaction” (section 13(2) and (3) read with the definition of ‘transaction’ in section 1 of the ECT Act).
